APPLICATION SUMMARY. You must complete all portions of the application and answer all questions.

- 1. <u>Current Contact and Employment Information.</u> TBLS requires an office address, office phone, and your office and personal e-mail for contact purposes. TBLS also requests that you provide your home address and home or cell phone number. Please make sure you have provided your most current email address to TBLS so that we can keep you updated on the status of your application. Please be sure to contact TBLS to update your changes to your contact information.
- 2. <u>Employment History.</u> You are required to have met a minimum of 5 years' actual experience working as a paralegal under the ultimate direction and supervision of a licensed attorney <u>BY DECEMBER 31st</u> of the year application is submitted.
- 3. **Resume.** You must submit a resume reflecting your activities for at least the 5 years immediately preceding application.
- 4. **Professional and Educational Information.** In addition to meeting 5 years of actual experience as a paralegal, you must meet one of the following requirements BY THE APPLICATION FILING DEADLINE:
 - Two additional years of actual experience working as a paralegal under the ultimate direction and supervision of a licensed attorney, for a total of 7 years of actual experience;
 - Successful completion of the National Association of Legal Assistants (NALA) Certification examination;
 - A baccalaureate or higher degree in any field;
 - An ABA approved program of education and training for paralegals;
 - A paralegal program that consists of a minimum of 60 semester credit hours of which at least 18 such credit hours are in substantive legal courses; or
 - A paralegal program that consists of at least 18 semester credit hours of substantive legal courses, plus at least 45 semester credit hours of general college curriculum courses.
- 5. <u>Continuing Legal Education.</u> You must complete 30 hours of CLE in the specialty area within the 3 years immediately preceding application through December 31st of the year you submit the application. Of the 30 hours of CLE, 10 hours may be self-study in the specialty area.

- 6. <u>Disclosure of Conduct.</u> You must answer questions as to whether you have ever been subject to an unauthorized practice of law complaint by a UPL Committee of SBOT; disbarred by SBOT or any other state licensing entity; found guilty of professional misconduct by the TXPD Professional Ethics Committee or any paralegal organization, unauthorized practice of law committee, or a court; or convicted of, or given probation or fined for, a serious crime as defined in the TBLS Standards for Paralegal Certification, Part I-General Standards, Section III, B.
- 7. <u>Substantial Involvement.</u> You must demonstrate your substantial involvement and special competence in oil, gas and mineral law. Your application cannot be processed unless the information requested in this section is provided.
 - You must have devoted a minimum of 50% of your paralegal activities to Texas oil, gas and mineral law as
 defined in the Specific Area Requirements for Oil, Gas and Mineral Law during each year of the 3 years
 immediately preceding application.
 - You must describe your participation, responsibilities, and the frequency of the paralegal activities you have performed in Texas oil, gas and mineral law within the 3 years immediately preceding application.
- 8. Applicant's Agreements and Authorization. You will confirm by signing and dating the application that you have answered all questions completely and truthfully; you have not modified or altered the content provided on the application; agree to abide by the TBLS Standards for Paralegal Certification and TBLS Paralegal Rules and Regulations; authorize all persons and/or entities to provide TBLS with information relevant to the investigation of your application, including records in possession of the Minimum Continuing Legal Education Department of the State Bar of Texas; understand that all information received by TBLS is treated confidentially and that you have no right of access to information received by TBLS from third parties.
- 9. <u>Testament of Supervising Attorney.</u> Your current supervising attorney must complete this part of the application to verify that you are currently employed and supervised by an attorney duly licensed to practice in the State of Texas. Your supervising attorney will also need to affirm that he or she has reviewed the TBLS Standards for Paralegal Certification and confirm that you are performing the various paralegal activities and responsibilities as set forth in your application. TBLS at its option may request at random, additional attorneys and/or judges to attest to your competence in the specialty area.
